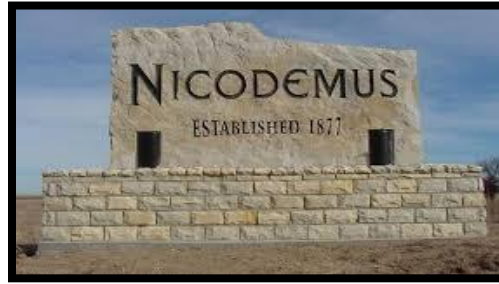


139TH YEAR NICODEMUS EMANCIPATION/HOMECOMING CELEBRATION
